The Regions of Durham and York are currently undertaking a review of potential sites within their boundaries that could provide a suitable location to build and operate a new Thermal Treatment (i.e. Energy-from-Waste) facility. This project is being completed under Ontario's Environmental Assessment Act and will be subject to all relevant regulatory approvals processes. This industrial facility will thermally convert the garbage that remains after recycling and composting into energy. At this time, it is estimated the facility will generate approximately 20MW of electricity and an additional 40MW of process heat. Durham and York Regions are soliciting interested parties to identify potential publicly or privately owned sites that could be included in the evaluation of alternative locations for the facility. In order to meet the size requirements of the proposed facility, a site of approximately 10 to 12 hectares (25 to 30 acres) is required.

Once identified, the site will be subject to a rigorous screening and evaluation process to identify its suitability for the proposed industrial land use. This screening process will include a review of the site's proximity to sensitive land uses (i.e. residential and recreation areas, natural heritage features, etc.) as well as its proximity to required infrastructure and transportation networks.

The following sites will not be considered as part of this process:

- Lands protected by Provincial or Federal Legislation;
- Designated Residential Lands;
- Designated Natural Heritage Features (Wetlands, Hazard Lands, Conservation Areas, etc.);
- Designated Prime Agricultural Lands;
- Designated Park/Recreational Lands;
- Designated Institutional Lands;
- Airport Lands regulated by Transport Canada.

1.0 Introduction

The Regional Municipalities of Durham and York, located in the greater Toronto area, Ontario, Canada, are currently undertaking a review of potential sites within their boundaries that could provide a suitable location to build and operate a new Thermal Treatment (i.e. Energy-from-Waste) facility. This project is proceeding under Ontario's Environmental Assessment (EA) Act, in accordance with the approved Environmental Assessment Terms of Reference for this project and all other relevant regulatory approvals processes. Detailed information about the EA Terms of Reference for this project may be obtained through the project website at <http://www.durhamyorkwaste.ca/> or at one of the Information Sessions noted in Section 12.0.

This Request for Expressions of Interest (REOI) is part of a process to identify a site for a facility that may ultimately be offered to vendors in a two-stage (RFQ-RFP) vendor selection process.

The industrial facility will thermally process the garbage that remains after recycling and composting to produce energy. Durham and York Regions are soliciting interested parties to identify potential publicly or privately owned sites that could be included in the evaluation of possible sites for this facility. Note that the Region of Durham is issuing and administering this REOI on behalf of both Regions.

2.0 Purpose of this REOI

The purpose of this Request for Expressions of Interest is to provide a final public notification to any party interested in proposing a site for a potential new Thermal Treatment Facility. There will be no evaluation or screening of potential sites directly through this REOI process, however, submissions received will be subject to a pre-established site evaluation and screening process. Detailed information about the screening and evaluation process may be found in Background Document 2-3 entitled "Consideration of Alternative Methods of Implementing the Undertaking" which can be accessed via the project website home page.

This REOI is, in effect, an extension of the previous "Call for Willing Sellers" issued on November 21, 2006 by the Regions of Durham and York (please refer to Appendix "A"). The request is being reissued to provide additional response time and a broader public notification to potentially identify additional sites.



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If you submitted a potential site during the November 2006 "Call for Willing Sellers" please do not resubmit information on that same site by responding to this REOI. (Note that any terms herein relating to the screening and evaluation of potential sites are intended to refer to the pre-established site evaluation and screening process and not as a separate process associated with this REOI).

3.0 Notice to Vendors of Waste Processing Technologies

As part of the approved EA Terms of Reference for this project, it was proposed to allow vendors of thermal waste treatment technologies¹ the opportunity to submit a site for consideration. Any sites offered by potential technology vendors must be offered separate from, and without any conditions regarding the use of the vendor's technology on the site.

It should be noted that vendors would be permitted to offer thermal treatment facility sites in Ontario, but outside the Regional boundaries of Durham and York. Such facilities however must have a Certificate of Approval that allows the receipt of waste from Durham and/or York or at a minimum, the proponent offering the thermal treatment facility site must have an approved EA Terms of Reference and be in the process of completing an Environmental Assessment that would lead to obtaining the required approvals for a thermal treatment facility capable of accepting Durham and York Region's residual waste.

NOTE: The site selection process will occur independently of the RFQ/RFP process to identify the preferred technology vendor(s). This REOI therefore represents the final opportunity for vendors to submit a site for consideration. There will be no opportunity to submit a site for consideration as part of the RFQ/RFP process to identify the preferred technology vendor(s).

4.0 Notice to Industrial Users of Heat Energy

At this time, it is estimated the facility will generate approximately 20 megawatts (MW) of electricity (net of in plant requirements) and an additional 40 megawatts (MW) of process heat. By co-locating the EFW facility on the site of the process heat load it may be possible to improve the overall efficiency of the process and potentially provide additional operating cost benefits to both the industrial host and the operator of the waste facility.

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Industrial plants with significant on-site process heat requirements would be ideally suited, provided that there is adequate site area as described further in Section 10.0 "Site Size Requirements".

Respondents should indicate in their submissions whether the location of the proposed site can utilize the energy generation potential of the EFW facility and, if so, briefly describe how it could be utilized.

8.0 Changes to REOI and Responses to Requests for Clarification

9.0 Consent of Property Owner

Respondents are advised that if a proposed site is recommended for short list evaluations, a written consent of property owner will be required. More details will be provided to applicable respondents at that time.

10.0 Site Size Requirements

In order to meet the size requirements of the proposed facility, a site size of approximately 10 to 12 hectares (25 to 30 acres) has been estimated. This site size estimate is based on a "stand-alone" facility with provision for expansion from 250,000 to 400,000 tonnes per year, on-site ash processing, storm water management features, parking for visitor's vehicles, on-site roads for full management and queuing of waste and post processing residue vehicles and adequate buffer zones and set-backs. Should respondents have a parcel of land smaller than that described above, but still capable of meeting the minimum facility size and infrastructure requirements where some required infrastructure may already exist on a companion site or where the potential exists for infrastructure sharing between sites, you may submit the site for consideration. On-site infrastructure required will include:

- ▶ A building structure approximately 210m by 110m (approx 2.3 ha.).
- ▶ Parking sufficient to manage approx. 100 vehicles (approx 0.2 ha)
- ▶ Truck access roads for the delivery of waste and removal of ash
- ▶ Weigh scales and sufficient roadway to manage the queuing of waste collection vehicles and/or transfer trailers (approx. 200m).
- ▶ Other site specific required buffer zones and set-backs

This process will be ongoing for a number of months until a final site is selected. The site selection will be independent of the procurement processes for the design, construction and operation of the proposed facility, which will include a request for qualifications "RFQ", followed by a request for proposals "RFP". Further, the intent is that the chosen site will be the site for which submissions against the request for proposals will be based.

The request for qualifications (RFQ 601-2007) will be an unrestricted public opportunity for interested parties to submit their qualifications for the design, construction, and operation of the proposed Thermal Waste Facility. Proponents deemed qualified (by an evaluation process that will be identified in the RFQ) will be invited to submit detailed proposals against the RFP.
